- The committee does supply green plastic vases and these <u>must</u> be used for all daffodils.
- All exhibits must be grown by the Exhibitor and proof of ownership is to be given if called upon (except in decorative work).
- No supports allowed.
- Naming of daffodils is desirable.
- All exhibits to be staged as directed by the stewards.
- All exhibits to be judged under N.S.W. Royal Horticultural Society Standards.0
- Judges decisions will be final.
- "D" means distinct or different
- "NND" means need not be or not necessarily distinct or different.
- "Embellishment" means any horticultural material other than flowers.
- "Novice" means an exhibitor who has not won more than five 1<sup>st</sup> prizes at the Blayney Flower Show.
- **"Progressive"** means Exhibitors who have not already won three champion prizes or ten 1<sup>st</sup> Prizes in the Progressive Section at previous shows.
- Champions can be chosen from collections.
- Note: 3 Flowers to be shown per vase where classes call for 3 or 6 blooms. (except Classes 1-4)
- The hall will be opened and stewards available for receipt of entries from 2pm Friday 8th September 2023 and from 7am Saturday 9th September 2023.
- ENTRIES CLOSE AND ARE TO BE STAGED BY 10AM for all classes so judging can proceed and be completed in time for 12 noon opening.
- Exhibits must not be taken from the hall before 4.30 pm
- Presentation of trophies 4.00pm
