



All sideshows operating must have proper risk insurance cover.

COSTS:

- **GROUND RENT:** Sideshow alley -\$3.00 per metre, plus \$20.00 electricity pending current charges.
- **MARKET STALLS** - Minimum charge \$30.00 to be paid to the Ground Stewards
- **TRADE EXHIBITS** such as machinery, motor cars etc. \$5.00 per metre.
- **COMMERCIAL EXHIBITS** \$5.00 per metre.

The Association reserves the right to refuse any space allocation as they think fit.

The Ground Stewards have full control; of all ground space & camping areas & is empowered by the committee to use their own discretion on all matters.

MAIN PAVILION EXHIBITS

The Committee will accept no responsibility for accident to exhibit, competitor or spectator during our Show. All exhibits must be bona-fide property of exhibitors at time of entry, unless otherwise expressed in the schedule. The name, residence & district of exhibitor must be given when entering exhibits. Exhibitors shall if required furnish a statutory declaration as to the bona-fides of their exhibits. All exhibits must be properly placed & ticketed on the day & hour specified in the schedule & time sheets; at which hour the judges will commence inspection.

Exhibits entered in the wrong class may be placed in the correct class by the Stewards, if authorised by the Judge. No exhibit shall be removed before 4.30pm unless with the permission of the Stewards of the section. The Association will not be responsible for any accident caused through or by any exhibit and will not under any circumstances be responsible for any loss, injury to, or mis delivery of any exhibit of any kind or for any damage done thereto. Exhibitors shall accept the decision of the Judge or Judges appointed by the Committee of the Association. Any exhibitor or other person interfering with the Judge or calling into question his or their awards on the ground or be guilty of unseemly conduct to any Judge or Steward or Official of the Association may be expelled from the ground, and if an exhibitor, his exhibits be disqualified.

Judges, upon arrival at the showground, shall report to the Secretary's Office for direction. Only authorised persons will be allowed in the vicinity of the Judges whilst judging. The Judges shall have power to disqualify & mark as disqualified any exhibit which in their opinion does not comply with the regulations and class and shall enter the reason in their books. After judging, Stewards are to obtain Awards Book and please return same to the Secretary's Office. All protests fully setting out the grounds of such protest in writing must be lodged with the Secretary before 6.00pm on the Show Day, accompanied by a fee of \$10 which shall be forfeited to the Association if the Committee deems the protest frivolous. In all protests the decision of the Committee shall be final & without appeal.

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INSTRUCTIONS TO STEWARDS

The Society will take all reasonable care of exhibits received for exhibition but accepts no responsibility in connection with any exhibit, & every exhibitor who delivers any article, bird or animal to the Society representatives for exhibition, does so in accordance with these rules.

STEWARDS IN ALL SECTIONS SHALL:

- Attend at the time & place notified
- Wait upon the Judges, afford them all the information & attention necessary to the discharge of their duties, but must not say anything to influence their decision.
- See that all classes in the respective sections are judged.
- Countersign the Judge's awards, obtain prize cards from Secretary & affix to the exhibits.
- Remove all exhibitors & other persons from the vicinity of judges while judging.
- Not to reveal the name of any exhibitor or repeat the Judge's remarks.
- Arrange among themselves for constant supervision of their Sections.
- In case it is advisable to reject any exhibit or in doubt on a matter, report same to Secretary.
- Pavilion Stewards are requested to attend close of Show to deliver exhibits to exhibitors or their authorised receivers.

It is strongly recommended to arrive early & acquaint themselves with their duties.

*All competition at this show is governed by these regulations and by the Agricultural Societies Council of NSW Rules for Discipline in Horse Sections at Shows which can be viewed at www.agshowsnsw.org.au Should it become necessary for the ASC Disciplinary Committee to open an inquiry into any aspect of competition in this Horse Section, this Society will support any penalty imposed by that Committee as a result of the inquiry and will support penalties resulting from enquiries arising from Horse Sections at other NSW shows.

INDEMNITY AND WAIVER FORMS: available as a fillable pdf file from The Horse Committee will take all care in managing the Section, but competitors taking part in this Horse Section do so at their own risk. Each adult competitor must, before competing, complete and sign a form indemnifying the Blayney Show Society and waiving any claims against the Society for any injury sustained in competition or for loss or damage to the competitor's property or damage caused by the competitor or his/her animal(s) at the Show. A similar form must also be completed and signed by a parent or guardian for each competitor who is under 18 years of age. ALSO, on each Waiver, each horse with which the competitor is involved in competition at the Show must be listed together with the **Property Identification Code (PIC)** of the property from which the horse came to the Show.

Competitors & Horse Handlers MUST WEAR A WRISTBAND before entering any ring event, obtained when completed Waiver is presented to the Horse Entry Box.

1. The Committee reserves the right to substitute, alter or delete without notice, any event on the programme.
2. The LOCAL AREA has been defined as the Blayney Shire
3. For local events horses or riders are those who reside in the Blayney Shire or are active members of the Carcoar Pony Club.
4. Only competitors actually taking part in an event will be allowed in the ring
5. The start of events will not be unreasonably delayed for competitors taking part in other events
6. Perpetual trophies will remain the property of the Show Society AND stay with the Society.
7. In all Breed Classes, horses must be registered with appropriate Breed Societies and papers MUST be provided if requested.
8. Pony Club riders are to be in full Pony Club uniform with the approved safety helmet and horses are to be shown in snaffles. No bit and bradoons permitted. Pony Club Rules will be respected.
9. There must be two (2) entries in classes before a Champion Ribbon will be awarded OR at the Judge's discretion
10. Entry Tickets are definitely NOT refundable
11. All riders must compete in headgear suitable for the event
12. Horses can compete in either the Hack or Hunter Classes but NOT in both.
13. Drug testing may be carried out at this Show. Any competitor found to have breached the ASC disputes and disciplinary regulations will be investigated by the ASC Disciplinary Committee
14. Protests must be submitted in writing to the secretary accompanied by a \$50 fee which is refundable if the dispute is upheld

STALLIONS: Official discs signifying a stallion must be displayed on both sides of the horse at all times. Stallions must be suitably restrained at all times by a person over the age of 17 years. Must wear a collar and be securely tied to a truck or trailer and supervised at all times. Such vehicle must display an official magnet giving notice that a stallion is on board. Stallions are NOT permitted to compete in Hack, Riding or Turnout Classes specific stallion Breed Classes may be exempt. Stallions may be substituted in prize-giving ceremonies with another horse should the rider deem it to be safer.

Physical competitions and activities, Events and use of the Suppliers' facilities are all dangerous recreational activities. This document is a risk warning for the purpose of section 5M of the Civil Liability Act NSW 2002. This risk warning is given by or on behalf of the Suppliers.

This document acts as an exclusion of liability under Part 1A Division 5 of the Civil Liability Act NSW 2002 if the services supplied by the Suppliers are supplied without reasonable care and skill.

Section B - Participant's acknowledgements

By signing this document I acknowledge that:

1. Participation in the Event and/or use of the Suppliers' facilities is a recreational service for the purposes of section 139A of the Australian Competition and Consumer Act (Cth) 2010 and a recreational activity for the purposes of section 5K of the Civil Liability Act (NSW) 2002.
2. I participate in the Event and/or use of the Suppliers' facilities at my own risk.
3. Participation in the Event and/or use of the Suppliers' facilities is a hazardous activity and involves a significant risk of physical harm and may result in injury, loss, damage or death to me and others.
4. Participation in the Event and/or use of the Suppliers' facilities requires certain skills and experience. I declare that I have sufficient skills and experience to be able to safely and properly participate in the Event and/or use the Suppliers' facilities.
5. Animals can act in sudden and unpredictable ways, especially if frightened or hurt, or if exposed to loud or unfamiliar noises.
6. The Event will be held in close proximity to rides and large groups of people and there may be loud and unfamiliar noises which can frighten animals used in the Event.
7. If the Event is held outdoors, there are risks to me as a result of the weather conditions, including either extreme hot or cold weather, rain or wind.
8. Insects or other animals may cause animals used in the Event to become frightened and act in an unpredictable way.
9. In handling animals, there is a risk of suffering injury including injuries caused by the animals.
10. I am responsible for ensuring that I have and will wear equipment suitable for my safety in my participation of the Event and/or in using the Suppliers' facilities.
11. I am responsible for the condition of any tools and equipment and ensuring that they are appropriate for the Event and/or in using the Suppliers' facilities.

12. I use the Suppliers' facilities, including for the Event entirely at my own risk, as I find them and with the prior acceptance of the risk of possible danger to me, both obvious and inherent.
13. At the time of participating in the Event and/or in using the Suppliers' facilities, I will not to any degree be under the influence of alcohol or illicit drugs.
14. I will not consume any alcohol or illicit drugs while participating in the Event and/or in using the Suppliers' facilities and agree that such use may result in my being excluded from the Event and/or from using the Suppliers' facilities with no entitlement to any refund of money paid to the Suppliers for entry.

INGREDIENTS:

- 2 cups of plain flour
- $\frac{3}{4}$ teaspoon baking soda
- $\frac{3}{4}$ teaspoon each of salt, cinnamon, ground cloves
- $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon ground nutmeg
- 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ cups of white sugar
- 1 cup of vegetable oil

- 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoons of vanilla extract
- 2 cups apple- peeled & cored and cut into 8mm cubes
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup flaked almonds
- Icing sugar for dusting
- 2 eggs

METHOD: Preheat oven to 180deg c/350deg F

- Grease and line a 21cm spring form cake tin
- Place flour, baking soda, salt & spices in a large bowl and whisk to combine
- Whisk oil and sugar in a bowl then whisk in eggs and vanilla
- Pour the wet ingredients into the dry and mix with a wooden spoon until JUST combined, Stir through apples
- Pour into cake tin, sprinkle with almonds
- Bake for 50 mins-60mins, Check at 50mins. It is cooked when a skewer inserted into the centre comes out clean. Cool for 10 mins before turning onto a rack. Dust with icing sugar

Class 25. ASC of NSW Rich Fruit Cake Competition

INGREDIENTS:

- 250g (8 oz) sultanas
- 250g (8 oz) chopped raisins
- 250g (8 oz) currants
- 125g (4 oz) chopped mixed peel
- 90g (3 oz) chopped red glace cherries
- 90g (3 oz) chopped blanched almonds
- 250g (8 oz) plain flour
- 60g (2 oz) self-raising flour
- 1/4 teaspoon grated nutmeg
- 1/2 teaspoon ground ginger
- 1/2 teaspoon ground cloves
- 250g (8oz) butter
- 250g (8oz) soft brown sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon lemon essence OR finely grated lemon rind
- 1/2 teaspoon almond essence
- 1/2 teaspoon vanilla essence
- 4 large eggs
- 1/3 cup of sherry or brandy

METHOD:

- Mix together all the fruits & nuts & sprinkle with the sherry or brandy.
- Cover & leave for at least one hour, preferably overnight.
- Sift together the flours & spices. Cream together butter & sugar with the essences.
- Add the eggs, one at a time, beating well after each addition, then alternately add the fruit & flour mixtures.
- Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon.
- Place the mixture into a prepared tin no larger than 20cm (8") square tine & bake in a slow oven for approximately 3 1/2 to 4 hours.
- Allow the cake to cool in the tin.
- Note: To ensure uniformity & depending upon the size, it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 2 or 3 pieces, cherries 4-6 pieces & almonds, crosswise into 3-4 pieces.

Prize money is sponsored by the ASC. Show Societies and Groups should pay the prize money to their winners, then apply to the ASC for reimbursement.

Winners at country shows will each receive a cash prize of \$25 and will be required to bake a second "Rich Fruit Cake" in order to compete in a Group Final to be conducted by each of the fourteen Groups of the Agricultural Societies Council of NSW.

The fourteen winners at Group level will each receive a cash prize of \$50 and are required to bake a third "Rich Fruit Cake" for the Final judging at the Royal Easter Show where the winner will receive a cash prize of \$100.00.

Note: In any year, an individual competitor may participate in only one Group Final representing a Show Society and, consequently, may represent only one Group in the subsequent State Final.

Attention Judges: All Fruit cakes are to be cut in half when being judged. The Height of the cake should not exceed 5.7cm (57mm)
